



THE POTTER VALLEY TRIBE WILL BE PRESENTING a WORKSHOP on FOREST CLEARING, FUELS REDUCTION and CARBON MANAGEMENT:

Use of Portable Field Kilns to Process Biomass and Make Biochar

FRIDAY, APRIL 23 at the EEL RIVER 14 PROPERTY 9 am – 2 pm

The work for this demonstration was funded in part with California Climate Investments funding granted by the California Natural Resources Agency, Department of Conservation through the North Coast Resource Partnership. Preparation of this workshop was produced by the Tribal Environmental Office of the Potter Valley Tribe, with funding from the USEPA General Assistance Program and technical assistance from the Sonoma Ecology Center.

The demonstration will utilize wood waste removed from the Tribe's Eel River – Upper Trout Creek, hauled and staged at the ER14 property. Experts in biochar production will assemble biochar kilns and produce biochar, which will be spread onsite for carbon sequestration and improvement of soil fertility on a disturbed site.
